Preparing Images for Competition – Sue Mayer-Miller

Sue took us through the process of how to process our image for presentation in any competition – whether it be a local monthly competition, or a larger competition that we wish to enter.

Such things to watch out for included –

- Read the rules for that competition as they vary
- Check brightness of image, it will be darker once printed
- Check for straight horizons
- Check for distractions within the image as well as along the edges.
- Distractions can include anything that takes your eye away from the main story.

TO OUR JUDGES THIS MONTH

Thanks to our PSQ Accredited judge Cheryl Robertson from Townsville who gave her critique this month for our images for Advanced, Intermediate and Novice Grades. We appreciate the time and care given to her extensive critiques and suggestions for improvement.

Thanks also to Belinda Eckford for giving great suggestions to our Beginner Grade.

We look forward to working with Angela Gregory from Bundaberg who is next month's judge. Angela has just been approved as an Accredited Judge, and we look forward to her suggestions on our images.

Our judge this month Cheryl Robertson has included the following comments at the conclusion of her judging this month.

MESSAGE FOR MEMBERS:

Thank you for trusting me to judge your images. As always it is a privilege and responsibility to try to do it in a helpful way. I hope my comments have been helpful, and that I have not been too disappointing for some, if I have pointed out things that could be better next time.

Some important things that I think it is useful to ask ourselves when choosing images to enter in judging or competitions are:

- Does everything in the frame as taken, really help the Composition to be balanced and help the viewer's eye to find the most engaging feature? Whatever the genre there may be things that can be cropped away. Because we are in the digital era, it is easy to make copies, do different versions of the crop and then compare. Remember that just because we could fit a large scene or object into the frame, and because it looked and felt good to be there, it does not necessarily mean that whole scene will work well with everything in the composition.
- Is there negative space that is not earning its keep, empty space that is simply taking up space in the frame without giving the composition balance in the frame, or giving an action a feeling of space for it to be happening, like space for a bird, animal or person to be gazing.
- Is the image we are considering to submit, technically good in basic things such as obvious horizons being straight, no dust spots, and is the image focused sharply where it was intended to be sharp.

Nobody gets everything 'right' every time, and sometimes, these considerations just don't matter as much as the overall effect. In the end, images are what we want them to be, and that does not always come across to a judge or other viewers. That is not discouraging because it means as long as we keep making images with our cameras, choose subjects that interest and stimulate us, and do what we can or want to do in post-processing, we will all be able to please judges and other viewers at least SOME of the time!





Judges Comments:

Judging Novice Grade is always the most difficult; finding the right balance between honest and useful comments that will help photographers to see where their skills can be improved, while not discouraging them from continuing to try. Another issue which can make it difficult, is not knowing what level of camera and lenses a person has to use, and these days very importantly, what level of skills with post processing software. It does not take expensive equipment to make a good image, but using what we have in the best way it can be used, is what makes a difference. Everyone starting out takes time to practise with their camera gear, get to know it as well as possible, and treat any stumbles along the way as part of the fun. It takes courage to put our images in any competition, even when we have advanced our skills and had lots more practice. Keep on doing it, because the pleasure and the satisfaction grows as we attempt and achieve more with our photography.
